IHCAM Spirituality Grant Program Guidelines – 2025

The Interfaith Healthcare Association of Manitoba (IHCAM) recognizes that spirituality is a vital dimension of whole-person care. The Spirituality Grant Program empowers member organizations to deliver, expand, or enhance spiritual care services, programs, and education aligned with IHCAM's mission of promoting faith-based, holistic, person-centred care.

To accommodate the diverse needs of member organizations, the program offers two distinct funding streams.

Funding Streams

1. Project Stream: Enhancing Spiritual Care Delivery

Purpose:

Support short-term, pilot, or one-time initiatives that enrich the spiritual well-being of residents, patients, clients, families, and staff.

- Eligible Activities:
 - Grief support, end-of-life spiritual care, or meaning-making groups
 - Interventions addressing loneliness, social isolation, or moral distress
 - Community-based interfaith dialogue or spiritual reflection circles
 - Art, music, or nature-based spiritual therapy
- Ineligible Activities:
 - Core operating expenses (e.g., rent, utilities, staff salaries)
 - Recurring programs already funded internally or externally
 - Programs without a clearly defined spiritual or interfaith component
- Proposal Requirements:
 - Clear project plan (objectives, timelines, locations, roles)
 - Detailed budget (including in-kind support)
 - One-page summary of intended outcomes, target population, and evaluation metrics



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- Final Report (Due within 30 days of completion):
 - Narrative report, final budget, photos/testimonials with consent

2. Education Stream: Building Capacity in Spiritual Health

Purpose:

Support education, training, and resource development that strengthens the capacity of staff, volunteers, and leaders in providing spiritual care.

- Eligible Activities:
 - In-service spiritual care workshops
 - Attendance at local conferences or retreats related to spirituality or servant leadership
 - Development of original spiritual care tools or resources
- Ineligible Activities:
 - Travel or education outside Manitoba
 - Non-spiritual care training
 - Honoraria for internal staff (unless creating new spiritual content)
- Proposal Requirements:
 - Curriculum outline (topics, duration, delivery format)
 - Learning objectives and evaluation strategy
- Final Report (Due within 30 days of completion):
 - Summary of outcomes and attendance list

General Eligibility (Both Streams)

Must be a current IHCAM member organization in good standing

• Application must be submitted or formally endorsed by the organization's CEO or Executive Director

• Activities must reflect IHCAM's mission and values, and demonstrate measurable community benefit.



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• Organizations that received a Spirituality Grant in the previous fiscal year (2024-2025) must wait one full year before reapplying (unless surplus funds allow a second cycle review).

Funding and Disbursement

• Maximum \$3,000 per stream per organization per fiscal year

• Funds are disbursed upon approval or based on a scheduled release as outlined in the grant agreement

Application and Review Process

• Deadline to apply: September 30, 2025

• Applications will be reviewed by the IHCAM Spirituality Grant Committee

• Review Criteria: Mission alignment, impact, feasibility, community benefit, and clarity of proposal
